





# Haddenham Scarecrow Festival 2021

We all need something to make us smile! The Haddenham Association of Scouts and Guides is delighted to confirm that our 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Scarecrow Festival will go ahead, in a similar way to our 2020 Festival held during the first lockdown. We have reviewed the successes and challenges of last year's event, and put together these guidelines, taking into account current restrictions and easing of social distancing rules.

## Entries open 1<sup>st</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> May

Entries can be submitted any time between Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> and Friday 28<sup>th</sup> May. All entries submitted by midnight on the closing date of 28th May will be included on the official List of Entrants and Scarecrow Trail Map. Unfortunately, any late entries received after 28<sup>th</sup> May, even the next day, cannot be included on the official map due to the tight printing deadline, but late entrants are welcome to display their scarecrow anyway in support of the event. Copies of the official Scarecrow Trail Map will be made available both online and from outlets in the village (full details about obtaining Trail Maps will follow). We are challenging people to use their imagination and creativity to make a Scarecrow **using any resources you may have** at home, in your loft, garden, shed or garage – no need to buy anything and no need to include straw unless you already have some or would prefer to do so. There are very few rules to follow:

- 1. Your Scarecrow can be ANY shape or size and made of any material or item(s).
- 2. All scarecrows or displays MUST be given a name. With a village-wide event on this scale, some name duplications are inevitable, but each and every creation is unique and appreciated, so please don't worry about this.
- Entries MUST be visibly displayed at the front of your own property 24 hours a day from 5<sup>th</sup> June (NOT BEFORE PLEASE) until the end of Midsummers Day Monday 21<sup>st</sup> June.
- 4. We kindly request that scarecrows are not used to make political statements or presented in any way which may cause offence to any spectators, especially young children it just needs to be fun!

Passers-by will be able to follow the Trail and enjoy the Scarecrows whilst walking around the village, adhering to current social distancing rules. We will ask visitors not to enter on to private property unless invited to do so. We will also arrange to display the scarecrows "virtually" for anyone unable to go out to see for themselves.
