





Copse using trees already growing in the village nursery




Perhaps RHS can advise on rare/ disappearing varieties that may thrive?

First of all a general point. Haddenham has thousands of apple trees in gardens, as the Transition group's apple pressing activities have demonstrated, so I think the orchard would be a much more valuable resource if it focused on other, rarer fruits, nuts etc. Given that the site is surrounded by housing, this may not be appropriate, but I think it would be a great idea if there was some livestock element, or perhaps some beehives. The manure would be useful for the trees, and it would also be a way of reintroducing some farming into the village, as well as being an educational resource for the community.


