The festivals take place on the first Saturday in July and second in December each year, with the next event being Winterfest on Saturday 9th December 2023. Junior practice is on a Wednesday evening and we run All Stars and Dynamos (nationally-recognised cricket programmes for u8s and u12s respectively) on Friday evenings in early summer, complete with bbq and bar for all the family to enjoy.

Haddenham Horticultural Society (HHS)

If you are interested in growing your own flowers or vegetables, or have a general interest in country crafts and/or the natural world, this is the club for you. Membership costs just \pounds 4 per year, covering all family members living at the same address.

We organise talks on varied subjects – not just related to horticulture – one or two coach outings a year, and several car share visits to nearby gardens or places of interest. We run a plant sale and small show each April. Our main show in September offers classes for vegetables, fruit, flowers, cacti and succulents, floral art, domestic items (preserves, baking and bread), beer and wine, art, crafts and photography, plus a wide range of children's classes.

All members receive two newsletters a year plus a yearbook which includes the schedules for our shows and other items of interest.

Members get a 5% discount on plants at Preston Bissett Nurseries, and may purchase composts and other horticultural goods and sundries, at very competitive prices, from the Aylesbury Gardening Society's Thurston Trading Store upon payment of £2.00 to become an "associate member". They can also buy seeds and some plants and sundries through HHS at a considerable saving on normal prices, often around 25-30%.

We also hold a Garden Reduced Price Entry Card, admitting one HHS member and a guest to RHS Gardens for 50% less than the general public rates.

Haddenham Parish Council

Haddenham Parish Council: what are we, what do we do, and what are our challenges?

• We are the lowest rung of local government, and the longest serving with records going back to 1894.

• Our budget of around £500,000 accounts for around 7.5% of Council Tax.

• We have 11 elected, unpaid Parish Councillors, and 4 paid staff; full-time Clerk and Facilities Manager and part-time Deputy Clerk and Assistant Clerk.

• Parish Council meetings are held every 3 weeks on a Monday evening, with a Planning meeting followed by a full Council meeting or one of the other standing committees. All meetings are now hybrid and open to the public to join in person or remotely, with time set aside for participation.

• We own and/or manage a variety of assets including street lights, playing fields, pavilions, play areas, village greens, ponds, and allotments.

• We are the sole trustee of the Banks Park Recreation Ground Charity which owns the land at Banks Park, and leases its various facilities (the village hall, community library, scouts and guides, dentist, and FITLIFE gym). • We are consulted on and respond to all planning applications (around 100 a year), and to forward plans affecting our village.

• We channel grants from outside sources to local bodies like the library and safe walking & cycling; we also give education grants through Haddenham Educational Charity.

Our current business plan priorities include:

a) dealing with the impact of being a "strategic settlement" due to grow by 50% (1000 homes) in the next few years, which amongst other things will see the transfer to us of extensive new sports and recreation facilities

b) adopting a planned approach to managing our assets - knowing what we have, what condition it is in, and having the reserves to repair and replace in a planned rather than reactive way

c) modernising our systems and procedures to make us match-fit to take on new responsibilities

• Bee squared –wildflower seeds to help feed the bees
